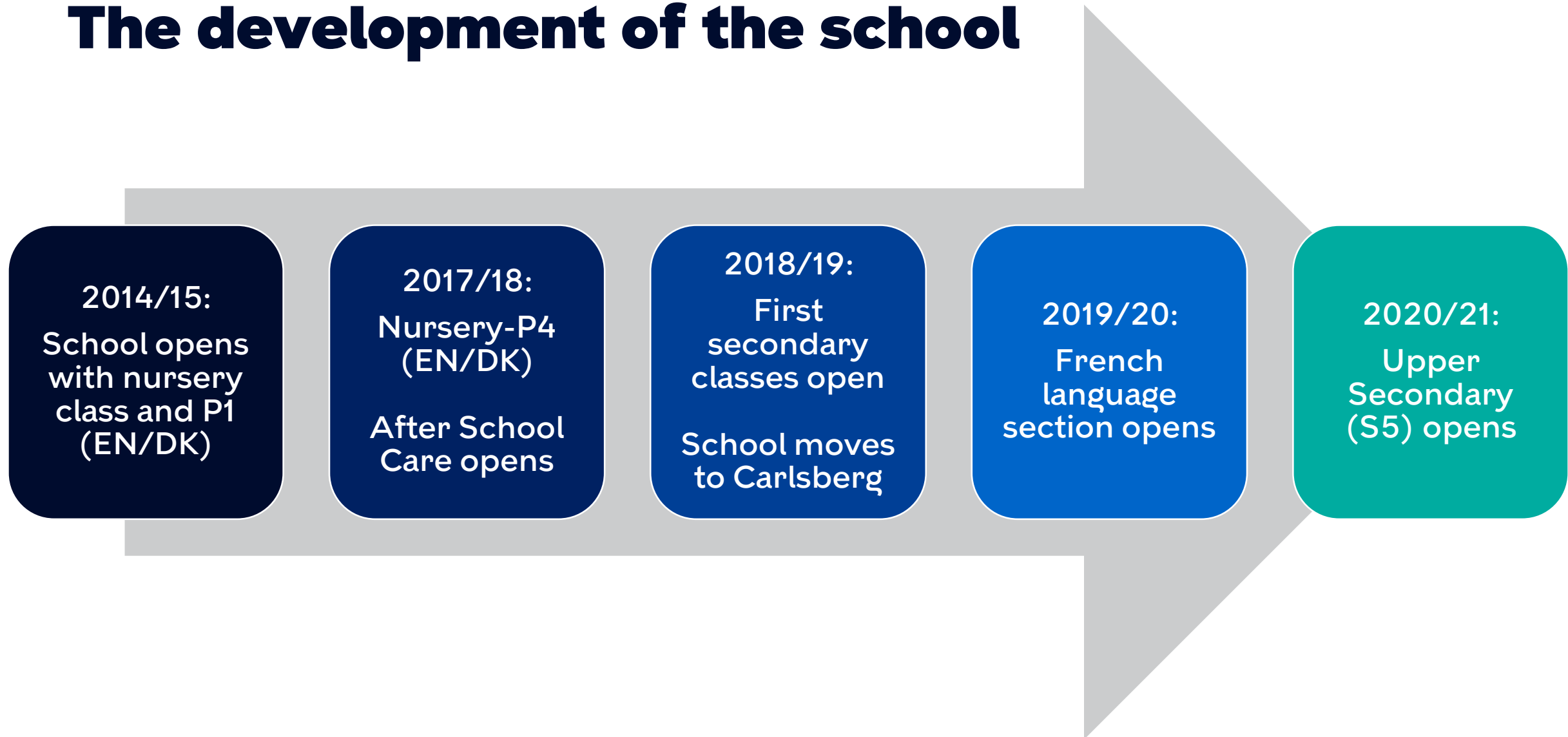

We show empathy and kindness towards each other and care about the greater world.

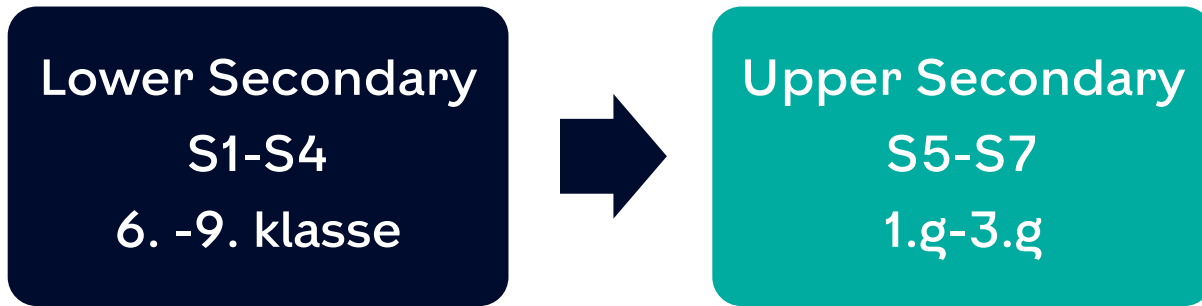
Upper Secondary



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What is upper secondary?



- After successful completion of Secondary 7, students are awarded the European Baccalaureate (EB) diploma
- The EB is recognised in all EU and many other countries for a high academic standard

Languages & Sections

- Two language sections - English and Danish
- Language 1 (L1): Your mother tongue and the language of the language section (Danish or English)
- Language 2 (L2): Your first foreign language (English, French, German)
- Language 3 (L3): Your second foreign language (Danish, English, French, German (compulsory until Secondary 6)).

What are the opportunities?

- English or Danish as first language (L1)
- Fluent speaker in 2-3 languages as some subjects also taught in L2
- All teachers are native speakers
- Able to understand academic concepts in many academic fields
- Introduced to many different subjects and have the opportunity to design your own Baccalaureate
- Understand and can navigate in different cultures and prepared to navigate in a globalized world
