Exchanges at ESCPH

One of the benefits of being part of the European School system is the opportunity for S4 and S5 students to take part in the exchange programme between European Schools. This enables students to improve their language skills, be immersed in a different culture and make new friends!

The programme allows <u>S5 students to attend for the duration of semester 1</u>, including exams in the hosting school. <u>S4 students may be allowed to go for 6 to 8</u> weeks, preferably during the first semester.

Students can request to be placed with a host family to speak a specific language in order to further their language acquisition.

Studies

While on exchange, students continue studying <u>the same subjects</u> they take at their own school, provided they're offered by the host school.

Any subjects not taught at the host school must be studied independently during the stay abroad, and for these subjects, the student's second semester results will be doubled.

In this particular case, the student takes responsibility for catching up with the subjects during his/her absence so as not to fall behind when back at ESCPH.



The phases

PHASE 1 - DECEMBER TO JANUARY

- ✓ Attend information evening on Mobility Programme
- ✓ Fill the initial request survey by 23rd of January 2023
- ✓ If your application is accepted = send the annexes to complete your application

PHASE 2 - FEBRUARY TO MARCH

- ✓ ESCPH will send your application to host school
- Once you have received confirmation of placement in a host school, they will let you know how to go about finding a host family = usually through contacting the host school's APEE (Parents Association)
- ✓ If you know a local family who could host your child, you can also contact them

PHASE 3 - MAY TO JULY

- ✓ You receive an acceptance letter
 - Communicate with host school and host family about practicalities
 - Books
 - Transport between school and host family
 - Lunch if necessary, make arrangements with host school canteen
 - Some schools require you to sign for additional items such as permission to leave, use of a locker etc.
 - Subject choices

⇒ Depending on the school chosen, the exchange should start between **late August and early September**



Results and reports

Results obtained in a host school during an exchange will be processed as follows:

• **6-8 weeks exchanges (S4):** Results will be brought home in the form of a report. Students will normally come back with at least an A mark in all the subjects followed

• **4-month exchanges (S5):** Results will be brought home in the form of a report and counted towards the end-of-year mark at ESCPH.

As in S5, there are only 2 exams that make up the B-mark, the exam result obtained in the host school will count as one of the 2 B-marks. All A-marks obtained in the host school will also be counted by ESCPH.

Costs

School fees for the exchange period are paid to your own school. The host school and family should not charge you for your stay, but this should be discussed with the Parents Association (APEE) of the host school.

You could be invoiced for additional expenses, such as school trips organised by the host school, if agreed in advance.

Host schools are not required to make any extra costs for guest students (i.e. Learning Support).
